Upon checking in you will receive a name badge, the convention program, and a souvenir bag of favors. We will have speakers during the evening dinners on Friday and Saturday. Board members will need to arrive in time to attend the annual meeting at 2:00pm.

We look forward to meeting you on Thursday night at the Azalea Welcome Social. You will be able to catch up with friends, new and old, and meet new members. The welcome reception will have an open cash bar. The azalea plant sales will be held in the ballroom lobby area and outside the hotel's lobby area on the patio. The plant sale times are listed in the convention program.

Friday, March 11, 2022

Touring Lafayette Azalea Trail & Speakers The Holiday Inn will serve a full buffet breakfast of eggs, bacon or sausage, hash browns, biscuits,

gravy, and juice beginning at 6:30 am. Friday tour transportation will be provided by local private school buses in "Good Ole School Days" style. The buses will begin loading at 8:15am and leave the front parking lot at 8:30am sharp.

This day of touring starts in the Gateway Lafayette Visitors Center (Photo 1). The first stop will be The Lafayette Museum & Gardens at the Alexandre Mouton House. We will be traveling through historic and cultural districts and garden neighborhoods. Lunch will be enjoyed on the University of Louisiana at Lafayette's campus at the UL Alumni Center. Catering will be by Sodexo, the University's caterer. Mr. Jim Foret, Horticulturist and Consultant Arborist will guide the university tours under the canopy of "Century Oaks" among the Encore[®] azaleas to see Cypress Lake and around to the dormitories to view the 'George Lindley Taber' Azaleas and Rose gardens. (Photo 2.) The grounds at the historic Heymann house



have beautiful Camellia gardens. In the 1930s and '40s this property was once the epicenter of the Heymann family nurseries that beautified much of Lafayette's Azalea Trail. Mr. Dan Hare, Senior Director of Alumni Facilities and Special Projects, will greet us with a short presentation. One of the fabulous architecture gems in this district is the A. Hayes Town House. (Photo 3.)



We will enjoy an Azalea walk around Girard Park Pond and ride through the Oil Center cultural & historic district. Early afternoon tours will be the Les Jardins de Mouton–Lafayette's showcase of the 'General Lafayette' azaleas, Bendel Gardens, and Greenbriar Estates, a quick drive through Moncus Park and a short shopping stroll through All Seasons Home and Garden Nursery. The Good Hope Hall will host an afternoon Tea and Cookies in Freetown-Port Rico Historic District. The Glen Armentor Law Offices are featured in this beautiful location with plenty of Encore[®] azaleas and 'Red Formosum' and 'Pink Formosum' azaleas.



Saturday, March 12, 2022 Touring Jefferson and Avery Islands & Banquet

Enjoy an early breakfast and be ready for a full day touring some of the best gardens in Acadiana. Our first tour will be to Jefferson Island to see Rip Van Winkle Gardens and Bird City Rookery. Mr. Garrie Landry, McIllhenny Botanist, will be the tour guide. This tour includes 15 acres of semitropical gardens on the grounds of the Joseph Jefferson Victorian Mansion, circa 1870, which sits among 350-year-old live oaks overlooking Lake Peigneur. (Photo 4.)

Beautiful peacocks live on the grounds and have an elaborate peafowl ritual each spring with their loud courtship mating calls heard throughout the gardens. (Photo 5.) The gardens include camellias, magnolias, azaleas, roses, hydrangeas, and many other native plants, bamboos, and hardwood trees. The Bird City rookery is home to over 260 species of birds, including the roseate spoonbill and the great white egrets.

For lunch you will enjoy a private catered event at the McIlhenny family historic home, "The Marsh House" on Avery Island. Catering will be provided by Nel's Creole Connection. This delicious lunch will include a cool summer salad with mixed greens baby spinach tossed in a pepper jelly vinaigrette and topped with tomatoes, purple onions, apple pieces, strawberries, mandarin oranges, and feta cheese sprinkles. The next course will be a creamy corn and crab chowder served in a toasted cored out bread bowl. The final treat will be a warm bread pudding topped with a refreshing Grand Marnier cream sauce. As we would say in French, "Bon Appetit!" Bring your good appetite!

After lunch, you will enjoy a guided coach tour through Avery Island's Jungle Gardens. These gardens were created by Mr. Edward Avery "Ned" McIlhenny. In the 1920s, he converted this private estate into a favorite south Louisiana tourist destination. The gardens have historic bamboo and exotic botanical plants from around the world. There are hundreds of azaleas here as well as camellias. It is a wildlife refuge for birds, alligators, and black bear. It remains the botanical marvel of the Deep South. Nearby is the Tabasco Bottling Factory. The Convention Banquet dinner with awards presentations begins Saturday evening at 6:00p.m. We will be serving great food, buffet style; Ca C'est Bon!

Sunday, March 13, 2022 Optional – Vermilionville Living History & Folk Life Park

"Laissez les bon temps rouler!" Travel on your own and "Let the good times roll" at Vermilionville. Enjoy Cajun and Creole cuisine, live music, and dancing! Vermilionville is a 23-acre historic and folklife park along the banks of the Bayou Vermilion that depicts the Acadian, Creole, and Native American cultures from the time-period 1765–1890. This historic village features guided



tours, costumed artisans, live music, cooking school, dance lessons, boat tours, and a gift shop that will leave you overjoyed with history and culture. Enjoy the beautiful azalea entrance and courtyard at this location. (Photo 6)
